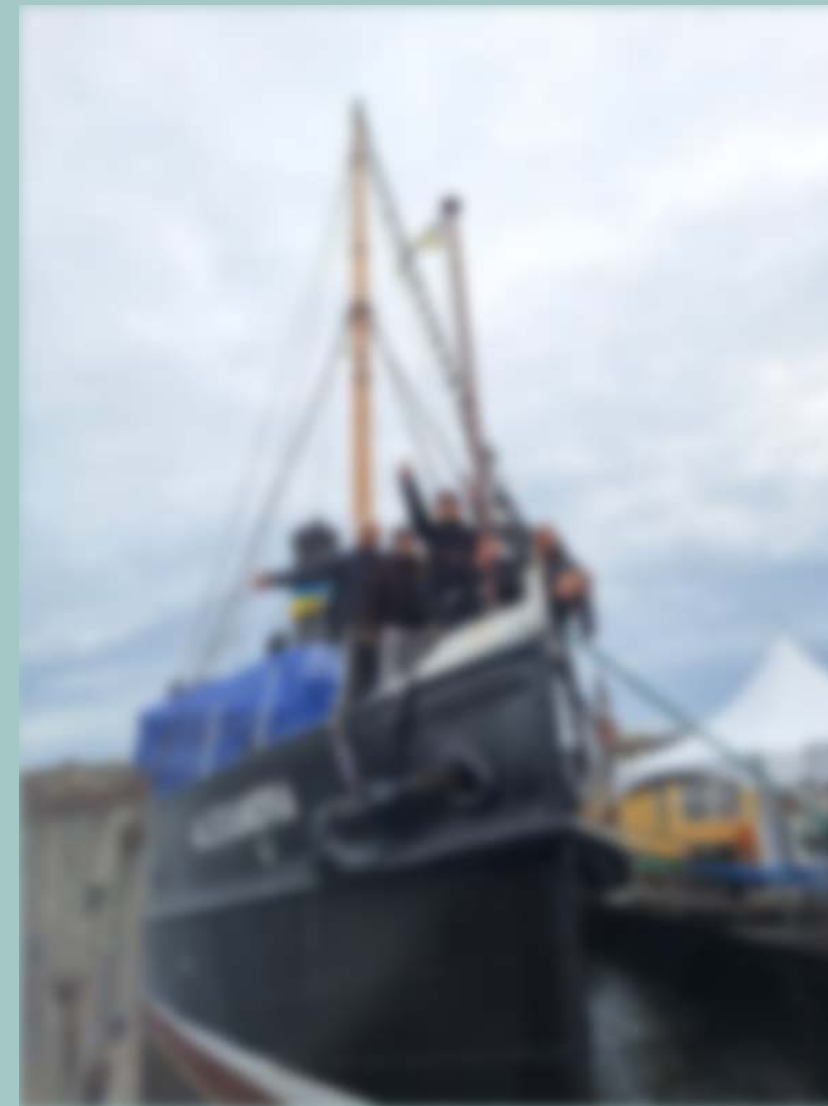


THIRD DAY - 12TH NOVEMBER

On the same day we also visited the “Museum of shipping and sea - Schiffahrtsmuseum” close to the dock.



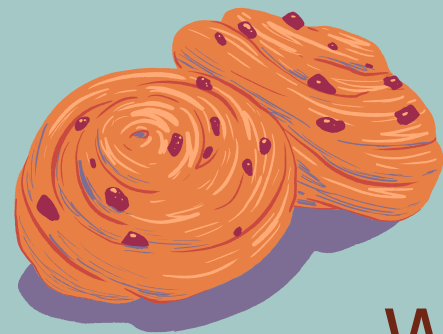
FOURTH DAY - 13TH NOVEMBER

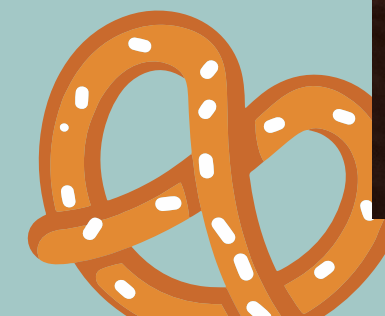
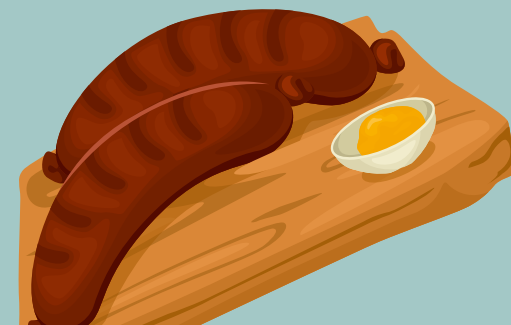
FOURTH DAY - 13TH NOVEMBER

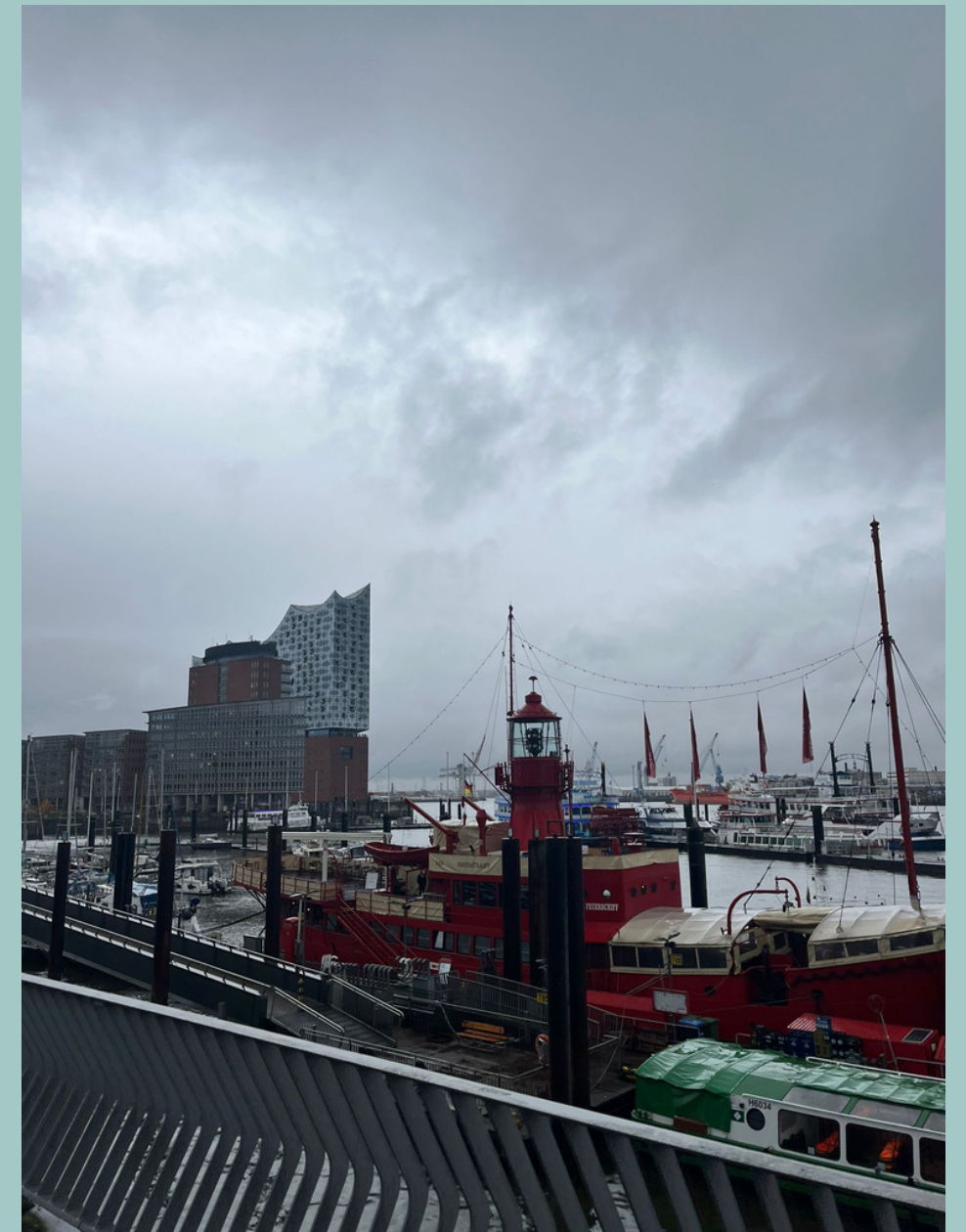
We tried different typical German dishes, like Schnitzel, Currywurst, Sauerbraten, many kinds of pastries and breads, and, obviously, Pretzels.

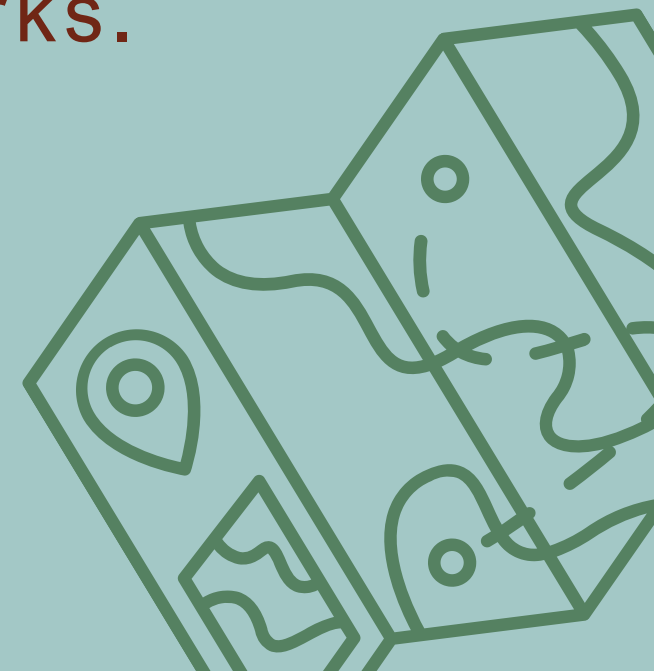
